

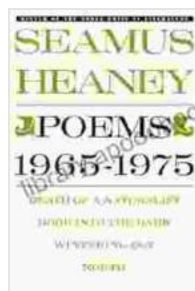

Water and ground in their extremity.

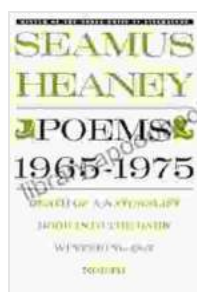
