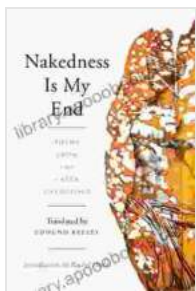


Nakedness Is My End: Exploring the Dark Side of Human Nature

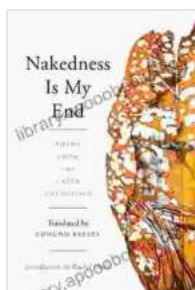
